- A traced outline of your forearm and open hand, decorated to look like an apple tree, on approximately 21 cm x 28 cm paper (adult may help to trace)

KINDERGARTEN:

- 3. A face made of dried pasta, seeds and/or beans on a paper plate.
- 4. A painting of a bee using only tempera paint on approximately 30 cm x 46 cm paper.

GRADE 1:

- 5. A 3D turkey made from a brown paper lunch bag.
- A coloured picture of a tractor, hand drawn, using crayons, approximately 30 cm x 46 cm
- Printing: First name only, printed on colourful construction paper in the shape of a cob of corn, approximately 15 cm. x 15 cm. Printed in PENCIL ONLY. No lined paper required. For this entry only, up to 10 submissions per class.

GRADE 2:
